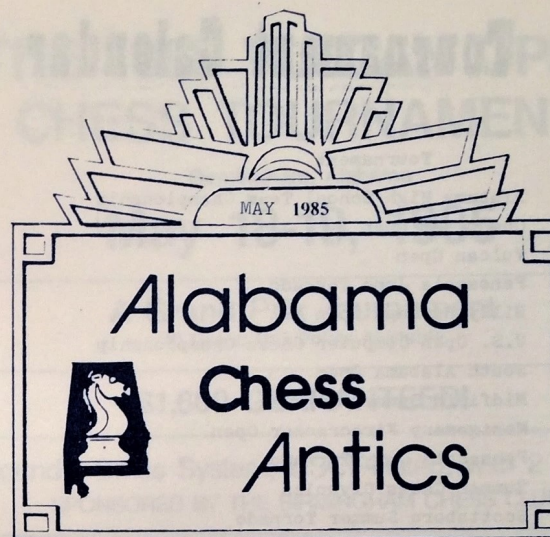

THREE SHARE STATE INDIVIDUAL TITLE

Brian "Killer" Keeley of Theodore High School successfully defended his Alabama Individual High School Championship April 20th by taking 1st Place on tiebreakers over Kelley "Savage" Marshall and David Luker. The tri-champions all scored 4-1 after Keeley beat Marshall, Marshall (also of Theodore) beat Luker (of Vigor High) and Luker defeated Keeley.

Marshall took the 2nd Place trophy on tiebreakers, while Luker placed 3rd and took the 1st Class D trophy. Benjamin Gayle, also of Vigor, was 2nd Class D.

Hanon Ben-aknin, another Vigor Wolf, placed 4th in the tournament and garnered the 1st Class E trophy.

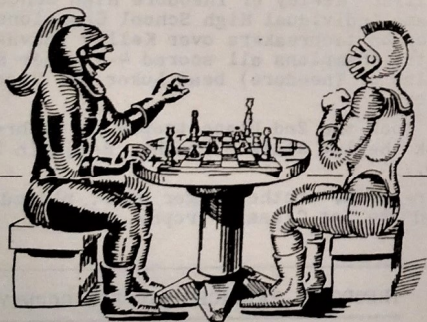

The Great American, also known as Brent Inman, climbed a few inches closer to that elusive title of "Master" with a fine performance in the Preliminary section of the Mobile Chess Club's 1985 Club Championship.

Gerald "Pirc" Squires, now thriving in Atlanta, was not around to defend his title, leaving Brent the only former champion (1981) to advance to the Finals, along with Tom "E.G.O." Denton and the illustrious Rhodes Peele.

The amazing computer Turbo-Star was the surprise of the tournament, however, as it proceeded to reel off three stunning upset victories in a row, followed by two more upset draws.

Five players advanced to the Finals for the Club Amateur title, headed by the highly-under-rated Greg "Bughouse" Krog and the steadily improving Tommy Wesson. Joining them will be James Gipson, James Vickers and Thomas Dunham. The tournament as a whole was a vast success, another indication of the Mobile Chess Club's growth under the fine leadership of Mr. Mercon Weeks.

The Mobile County High School Chess League

For the first time in 11 years, the 7-round season of the Mobile County High School Chess League concluded with two teams sharing the Championship.

In 1974 it was Blount and Shaw. This year Theodore and Fairhope battled their way to the top of the heap. Both teams compiled 6-1 slates, each suffering one loss: Theodore to the upstart Baker Hornets and Fairhope to the Theodore Bobcats in the final round.

For the Fairhope Pirates, it was the culmination of a long-held dream. It was primarily the determined leadership of Eric "Ace" Nager that inspired the Pirates to accomplish what even the Fairhope super-teams of the late '70 couldn't achieve - their first League championship.

For the Theodore Bobcats, it was a gut-check when their backs were against the wall. After watching their 20-match victory streak being snapped by the talented but inconsistent Baker Hornets in Round Four, they found their dream of a third straight County title seriously threatened. Nothing less than a victory over the unbeaten Pirates in Round 7 would insure the Theodore Dynasty.

Coach James Gipson's Vigor Wolves, led by David Luker and Chris Pen-darvis, captured the 3rd Place trophy with a fine 5-2 slate, losing only to the co-champions.

Mary Ann Willis' McGill-Toolen Yellowjackets, the winningest team in League history, took 4th Place with a 4-3 ledger. The 'Jackets B-Team, however, compiled a perfect 7-0 slate enroute to the B-Team Championship.

One note of sadness this year was the death of LeFlore High team sponsor Hope Carter after a lengthy illness. Ms. Carter's courage and dedication to the LeFlore chess program was honored by the creation of the Hope Carter Memorial Award, to be presented each year to the Chess Coach of the Year. The initial award went to Theodore sponsor Wayne Odom.

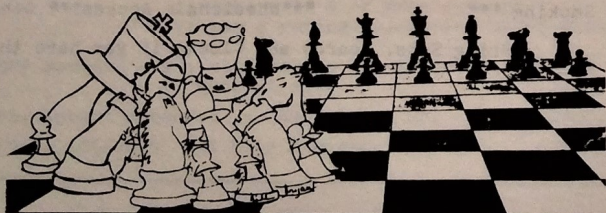
