Alabama chess Antics







STUART & DANA STATE CHAMPS

The Birmingham Chess Club's "Dynamic Duo" of Stuart Rachels and Dana Therrell became the second set of co-champions in three years of State chess championships. Stuart and Dana rose to the top of the Alabama heap with $5\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ slates, one point behind the overall winner, Boris Kogan of Georgia. (Thus ineligible for the Alabama title.)

Kogan, a highly regarded ex-Russian master, scored six wins in a row before drawing with Rachels in the final round.

For Dana, it was a successful title defense, as he was also champion in 1981. In recent history, only the formidable Steve Hudson had recorded back to back state crown victories.

For Stuart, it was a Manifest Destiny, as the young powerhouse has shattered records everywhere he has gone, foremost of which was the great Bobby Fischer's record of the earliest age of attaining Master status in the U.S.

Two other players who performed excellently and had a shot at the championship up until the final round were Jere Roland and Robert Pruitt.

Jack Gwin and 1980 State Co-Champ Joe Jurjevich tied for 4th place with superb 5-2 ledgers in the tough 52-man Open field.

Darryl Freeman's excellent 4-3 performance included 6 upsets (!) and netted the Montgomery boardsman 131 rating points!

All in all, the tournament was a great success with a grand total of 92 players in the two sections, and if memory serves that is a record attendance, at least for recent years. Congratulations to both the Anniston Chess Club and Tournament Director L. Thad Rogers.

MY CHESS OVER THE SUMMER

Following are some games from tournaments all over the ${\tt U.S.}$ which I played in this summer.

The following game is from the last round of the '82 U.S. Junior Open, in which I tied for first with David Gertler, a New Jersey master. We both had scores of 7-1. As a result of my performance in this tournament I will be seeded into next year's Junior Closed, which Joel Benjamin won this year.

This is where black missed a win. Endgames are the foundation of chess. The difference between not-so-good players and good or even great players is an understanding of the endgame. Anyone who has a desire to become a good chessplayer should master the endgame. But that is easier said than done!

And the win is.......

48...f4!! 49. gxf4+ ...

49. g4 hxg4+, 50. Kxg4 Ke4 -+; 49. Kg2 fxg3,

50. Kxg3 Ke4 -+

 $\frac{49...\text{Kf5}}{\text{and black's king penetrates decisively.}}$ A game with the identical theme was won by a friend of mine, except on the queenside.

The tournament produced a few surprises; the largest being, Otis Daniel ending in a tie for first place! Not only that, but he defeated a senior Master, two Candidate Masters and drew a Master while doing it! Congratulations, Otis. (He also picked up a hundred and fifteen rating points!)

Now for the results: 1st place in the Open section was shared by Michael Lucas (Ga) and Otis Daniel. Each player managed a total of 42 points.

Dana Therrell, Paul Kuroda (Ark), and Ben Sides each captured 4 points and a share of 3rd place.

Top Cat. I honors were shared by Robert Pruitt, James Carlton Johnson, Jack Smith Jr. (TN) and Craig Kozel (ARK) with 3 points each.

First place in Cat. II was taken by a loner. Tom Burkett managed 3 points. 2nd place ended in a 3-way tie. Art Ganey, James Waldrep and Ronnie Priest fought there way to a 2 point finish.

DUTIES

I have been so involved with my studies at college this year that it seems like I have been doing nothing chess-wise. But as usual I had been keeping track of the Antics, the stata tournament in Anniston, and the state clubs. I directed two major tournaments for the Huntsville Chess Club, the Space City Open and the North Alabama Invitational Scholastics, which drew 95 and 78 players. I helped the ATPA begin its enterprise of promoting tournaments by directing the North Alabama Open and the Confederate Open.

Unfortunately, not all my plans were completed. In one issue of the Antics I mentioned being in two-month's contact with each club and writing an organizer's newsletter. This plan was not realized; most of the material was gathered but there never seemed any time to type it up, collate it, and then mail it out. A lot of material was simply thrown away as it become outdated.

CLEARINGHOUSE

The clearinghouse worked quite well for the six-month period after the Queen of Hearts. There were many tournaments scheduled and all those who planned their dates found no conflicts. But I notice with the latest Antics that we have lapsed back into not everyone clearing their dates. I will take part of the blame as I did not directly contact many clubs during the last few months, but all the clubs should be coming to me first of their own accord. Alabama's tournament schedule is getting larger and larger as new clubs form and existing clubs have more tourneys. One hazard of the tight schedule is that the Ala. Team tournament could not find a good date.

C. ELECTIONS

The following members are listed for the offices they are running for. The spot for Secretary is unfilled as Ernie Cockrell just recently resigned. His duties will be temporarily filled for the state meeting. No candidate's letters were received by Lars for any office, but members may be nominated the day of elections.

The incumbents wish to continue to encourage the development of club activities and to help start new clubs. Plans are to finally do the paper work for obtaining an IRS tax-deductable status with strong support of Gerald Wheeler of Huntsville. Possibly the Southern Open will be revived if it is legal and feasible to do so.
